Key responsibilities

- To teach Music to primary section pupils (during PPA time)
- To provide specialist Music lessons delivered during teachers PPA time which provides cover for teachers across the school.
- To play a key role in developing the Music curriculum and resources
- To teach classes from Nursery to Year 6
- To liaise closely with primary section class teachers
- To liaise closely with secondary section Music teachers
- To be a member of the through-school Music team
- To work collaboratively with the through-school Music team
- To plan to ensure coverage of the Music National Curriculum and the school's Music plans
- To monitor pupil progress, ensuring secure teacher assessments inform pupil grouping and interventions effectively
- To assess how well learning intentions have been achieved and to plan future lessons and parts of lessons accordingly
- To provide timely feedback to children so that they are aware of their next steps and to plan accordingly
- Ensure that reporting is timely, accurate and effective
- To develop positive, strong relationships with pupils to support outstanding behaviour for learning
- To establish an environment in which children feel secure and confident
- To identify and plan for children who have particular needs (for example Special Educational Needs) and know where to get help, if needed.
- To manage the work of other adults in the learning spaces to enhance the learning opportunities for the children
- To run extra-curricular PE clubs
