

16-19 Tuition Fund Statement 2021-22

In the 2021-22 year Heathland Whitefriars Federation will receive £1,514 from the 16-19 Tuition Fund set up to assist with Covid-19 education recovery.

Who will be supported?

Heathland Whitefriars Federation 16-19 Tuition Fund will be used to support the education recovery of:

- all students aged 16 to 19 at Whitefriars School who have not achieved a grade 4 or 5 in English and/or Maths.
- those students at Whitefriars School from economically disadvantaged backgrounds who achieved grade 4 or above in English and/or Maths. (These are defined as students from the 27% most economically deprived areas of the country based on the index of multiple deprivation)

Tuition is prioritised for those students at Whitefriars School who have not achieved a grade 4 in maths and/or English in the first instance.

When identifying students at Whitefriars School, who need support from the Tuition Fund on the basis of economic disadvantage, the individual needs of students will be considered with the aim of assisting disadvantaged students to reach their full potential.

How will the 16-19 tuition fund be used?

The 16-19 tuition fund will be used at Whitefriars School to fund small group sessions which will focus on areas where students have been disadvantaged due to the Covid 19 pandemic and resulting lockdowns. These sessions will be scheduled in addition to the timetabled planned hours of each student and will be based on the individual needs of the student.

Examples include:

- Maths and English small group tuition
- Revision workshops
- Academic skills support and development
- Functional skill assessment and exam preparation
- 1:1 support for identified learners

Heathland Whitefriars Federation Commitment

In accordance with government guidance Heathland Whitefriars Federation is committed to:

- Producing a concise statement explaining how the funding received in 2021-22 will be used;
- Publishing this statement on the Heathland Whitefriars Federation website;
- Recording the use of the fund, including references to individual students who received support, and demonstrating the impact of the support provided;
- Delivering the extra tuition and spending the allocated funds in the academic year 2021-22 year;
- Notifying the Education Skills Funding Agency (ESFA) of any underspend from the Fund for it to be reclaimed
